Brian reported the Public Officials Workshop was held with 31 in attendance.

Brain reviewed various meetings and trainings he attended.

Brian reported a debriefing was held with regards to the fatal accident on 245.

Brian reported he is still waiting for the official award of the Hazard Mitigation Grant. Once he receives the official award he would like to hold a kick off meeting in January.

Brian reviewed emergency responses he reported to.

Sheriff – Ron Spike

Ron reviewed the following resolutions that would be needed. The Committee approved.

Ron reviewed the jail population report: Yates County: 40, Federal 7 for a total of 47. Of them there are 40 males and 7 females.

Ron reported there are currently only 2 individuals in the SWEAPS program.

Ron reviewed the revenue report which showed \$180,696.38 has been received through October.

Ron reported the NYS Education Department will be doing an audit next week for 16, 17 and 18 year olds that have been in jail. Ron explained cost wise he has spent more money than the program brings in so he will be ending the program at the end of the year.

Ron reported there have been a lot of parking complaints in Keuka Park. Ron explained 18 tickets have been issued within the last couple of weeks and one vehicle was towed.

Ron reported part of a grant requirement for a GTSG was to participate in a crackdown. On November 23rd a check point was setup on RT 54A for a 3 hour period and used this as a training operation for new deputies. During that time period there were 5 traffic tickets issued, one arrest for a felony DWI, and 1 arrest for possession of marijuana.

Ron reviewed the General Statistics, highlights follow:

Accidents car/deer: 66 Accident Prop Dam: 112 Civil Evictions: 8
 Total calls for Law Enforcement, Fire Departments, Calls For Service thru 911: 1,714 for the month.

Ron also noted that on Monday November 21st telephone calls alone into 911 were 423. At one time there were 5 individuals working in dispatch to keep up with the demands.

Ron reported he submitted the PSAP 2017 grant on December 1st and it has been accepted.

Ron also reported that the SICG 2016-17 grant was submitted today.

Ron reported he had purchased various equipment for the coroners through a Homeland Security Grant and that equipment has been issued.

Ron advised the SCOC jail inspector was here all last week and will be sending report.

Bonnie moved to enter executive session to discuss matters leading to the appointment or employment of a particular person with the Sheriff, the County Administrator and Legislators present, seconded by Dan.
