Emergency Management – Brian Winslow

Brian reviewed meetings, trainings and drills attended or sponsored.

Brian continues to work on Hazard Mitigation, and setting up a Box Alarm System (Automatic Mutual Aid) for the Fire Departments.

Brian reviewed the emergency responses attended.

Sheriff – Ron Spike

Ron reviewed the following resolutions that would be needed. The Committee approved.

- Create Temporary Correction Officer position
- Renewal of NYS-DOCS cook-chill food services contract for jail
- Authorize Chairman To Enter Into Settlement Agreement With Air Methods Corporation/Rocky Mountain Holdings/ Life Flight

Ron reviewed a vacancy review form for a Deputy Sheriff (Road Patrol) position.

Ron reviewed the General Statistics for April. Highlights follow:

Ron reported on the Jail Population: Yates County: 38 Federals: 13 for a total of 51. Of those there are 43 males and 8 females.

Ron reviewed the revenue report through April, which shows \$179,327.24 has been collected so far.

Ron reported there will be a presentation at the June 12th Legislative meeting for the Reaccreditation of Court Security.

Ron reported on a Car-Fatality investigation in the Town of Potter.

Ron reported Yates County Sheriff Office was selected as one of four National Institute of Justice research agencies. On May 24 interviews regarding the use of data were done.

Ron reported he took a correction vehicle and a patrol car out of service due to unsafe rusted out frames. Also, both used CID vehicles are having extensive maintenance costs.

Ron reported the Impound Yard was in need of repair and thanked Buildings & Grounds and Highway for doing the repairs.

Ron reported two Emergency Services Dispatcher’s graduated EMD training school.

Ron reported the fence at the Sherman tower site was damaged. Ron is looking into possibilities to strengthen the fence to eliminate the possibility of someone going through the fence and hitting the building. Also, the Village of Rushville DPW truck backed into a patrol car.

Dan moved to enter into executive session to discuss the employment history of an individual and contract negotiations with Council 82 with the Sheriff, County Administrator and Legislators present, seconded by Bonnie.
