Sharon reviewed the Quarterly ATI report which showed 7 individuals were supervised by the Pre-trial Release program at the end of the quarter. One of those individuals is currently being supervised by Ontario County PTR. There were 3 successful completions during the quarter, 2 individuals were sentenced to probation and 2 individual was sentenced to a conditional discharge. Eight people successfully completed their community service obligation this quarter. As of June 30, 2017 there were 29 active cases in 24 worksites throughout the county.

Sharon reviewed a handout on the Role of Probation in County Government that she obtained from the New York State Council of Probation Administrators.

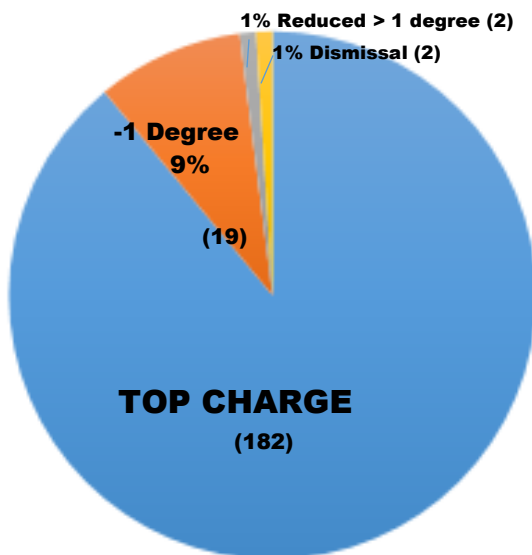

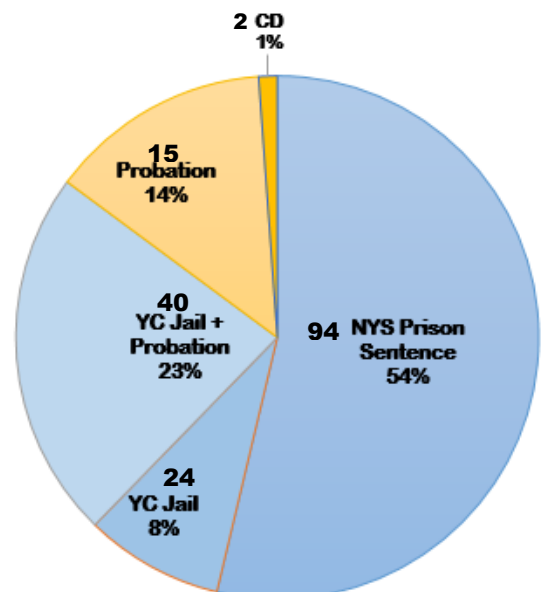

Emergency Management – Brian Winslow

Brian reported he assisted with an in house drill at Keuka College.

Brian reported he met with surrounding fire departments regarding mutual aid.

Brian reviewed trainings that were given.

Brain reviewed emergency responses attended.

Brian reported the date for the Strategic Planning to be held on September 21st in Dundee.

Brian reported he had the old dodge pickup stripped and there is a fire department that is interested in purchasing. Brian questioned if the Committee wanted him to sell at auction or help out a fire department. Brian was advised to use his best judgement in the disposal of the truck.

Brian reported work continues on the Hazard Mitigation Plan.

Sheriff – Ron Spike

Sheriff Spike could not attend the meeting. Undersheriff Davis reported in his absence.

Howard reviewed a Vacancy Review for a Correction Officer. The consensus of the Committee was to refill the position.

Howard reviewed a memo pertaining to the difficulty of hiring a part-time jail cook. The Sheriff would like to change the position to a full time position. The Committee approved.

Howard reviewed the following resolution. The Committee approved.

- Authorize Chairman and Sheriff to Sign Boarding Contract (Genesee Co.)
- Amend Resolution 210-17 (Authorize Contract with Dundee Central School for SRO)

Howard reviewed the General and divisional statistics report highlights are:

Animal Related: 104 Back up an officer: 10 Larceny: 16 Navigation related: 28

Foil requests: 103

Howard reviewed the revenue report which showed \$196,457.93 has been received so far through June and \$235,000 was budgeted.

Howard reported the Jail Population report: Yates County: 34, Federal: 9, Genesee County: 7 for a total of 50 of those there are 31 males and 19 females.

Howard reported the Sheriff is negotiating with the US Marshal Service for increased detention rate.

Howard reported the agency is preparing for major jail policy & operations assessment for five-year accreditation. Assessors from Monroe, Wayne and Broome Counties will be here three days this month.

Howard reported the Jail walk-in, forty yr. old refrigeration, is having issues. Buildings and Grounds is trying to repair it but so far has been unsuccessful. If it can't be repaired we may have to rent a refrigerated truck, etc.

Howard reported they have sent out a second RFP for the aging Jail Security Control System and awaiting a response from Cornerstone, Inc.

Howard reported a PO has been issued for low bid to repair and replace the security rec yard razor wire that came in at \$7,200.

Howard reported the agency is working with Buildings and Grounds for paint and floor options for the jail that are in need of refreshing.

Howard reviewed the State Commission on Correction 2015 memo on Substitute Jail Orders for the transfer of an inmate to another facility. Elden questioned if he could receive a copy of this. Howard or Jared will look in to it.

Howard and Bob reviewed the National Institute of Corrections (NIC) information on jail assessment. There would be no charge for their assessments. The consensus of the Committee was to move forward with the assessment from NIC.

Howard reviewed a new publication that was developed for Yates County Jail visitors.

Howard reported the Office of Court Administration has been notified that there will be several courts going on at the same time and there is a possibility of having 3 judges on site at a time. The Sheriff has been assured that the current staffing could handle the increase.

Howard reported on the homicide case convictions.

Howard reported there is a PINS Diversion Group being developed and the DSS investigator is being assigned to this.

Howard reported the agency received notification of a grant award for \$35,000 that will be used to purchase a vehicle for CID. The Sheriff has made a reduction to 2018 budget submitted to Budget Officer.

Howard reported the agency has been awarded a \$4,000 grant for Child Passenger Safety Seat program but it is not in effect until October.

Howard reported a PO for STN for the fiber connection from the Yates County Public Safety Building to the Sherman Tower has been issued. This connection will be used as the primary and the microwave connection will be used as a backup. Grant funding will be used for this.

Howard reported the state of NY is implementing a new electronic Death Reporting System for coroners.

Mark Morris reviewed information that he obtained regarding Steuben County's Jail and options that the County might want to look into.

Elden Morrison reviewed costs pertaining to the operation of the jail and options on how to possibly lower the cost of Public Safety. Elden also explained that he is considering offering a resolution on Monday to cease and desist boarding in outside prisoners. Also, Elden would like to see some directive closer to budget time directing the budget officer and Sheriff to make a serious attempt to bring these costs down by approximately 5% next year.

Tim reported in looking at the NYSAC conference information, there will be programs on Raising the Age, Raising the Age of Responsibility County Impact. HAB handling of Blue Green Algae, and Indigent Services. Tim would like to see legislators participate in some of these programs. Please coordinate with Connie for registration.
